






What to Do if Someone in Your Home gets Tested for COVID-19

				
<p><u>Feeling Sick?</u></p> <p>If a student/parent has a fever of 100 degrees or higher, even over the weekend, the student(s) cannot return to school until they get the results from a PCR COVID test</p> <p>If your child is exhibiting cold symptoms without a fever, make the determination if your child should stay home/get a test</p> <p>If one family member has a fever, ALL siblings must remain at home until test results are received</p>	<p><u>Doctor</u></p> <p>Visit your doctor or local clinic and get the PCR COVID test</p> <p>Although many doctor's offices are offering the Rapid test, our district is requiring the PCR test results and only those will be accepted for your child's return to campus</p>	<p><u>Test Results</u></p> <p>Most test results are returned within 2 to 5 days</p> <p>Please make sure to keep all siblings at home and work remotely until you receive your results</p>	<p><u>Results are In</u></p> <p>Once you receive the call about the test results, please have the doctor fax those results to our nurses office 854-6973</p> <p>If negative, our office will then contact you when we receive the results to let you know that your child is free to return to on campus learning</p> <p>If positive, please follow the directions of the Health Department. We will be in contact with you and them about returning to school</p>	<p><u>Welcome Back</u></p> <p>Once your child is cleared by the school and/or the Health Department you can return all of your children to school</p> <p>If they are still not feeling well, please keep them at home to ensure the health and wellbeing of their classmates. Their siblings are free to return</p>
